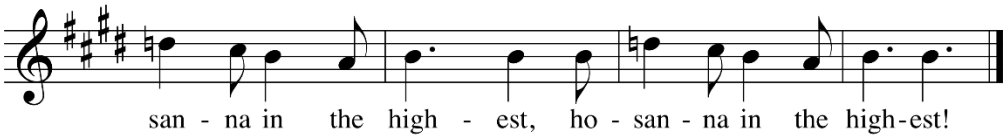

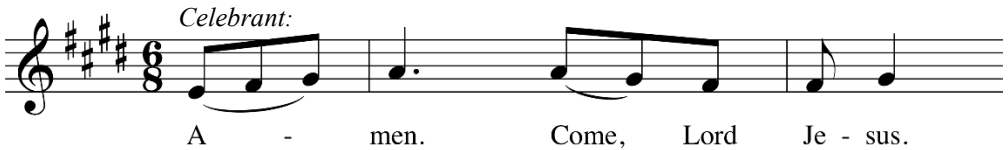

Remembering his command to love one another, his life and death, his resurrection and his ascension, we pray for his coming again, even as we cry:







Thank You! – The Altar Guild extends their thanks to all those who have given flowers throughout the past year, helping to adorn the Altar each Sunday and on Christmas and Easter.

Rapid Response Team – In mid-December Grace Church held a ‘know your rights’ training for the benefit of the local immigrant community as well as any interested businesses. About forty people attended, from both groups. A follow-on action is to set up a Rapid Response Team, whose purpose is to help ensure any possible ICE raids are conducted without abusing the rights of the immigrants. Given that Trump’s inauguration is January 20th, we need to move quickly to organize and populate the team/sub-groups. Today, Sunday, January 12th, there will be a meeting following the morning service for those folks who are interested in being part of this effort.

Administrator Vacation – Parish Administrator Amanda will be on vacation January 12-20. If you have a church office need during that time, please contact Mother Paula.

Winter Weather, friendly reminder – It’s that time of year when the weather sometimes interferes with driving to church. If there is a winter weather advisory, be aware that driving may be tricky and we generally have a livestream link available on the weekly email. If there is a winter weather watch, be prepared for the situation to change quickly. If there is a winter weather warning (the weather service is saying it’s not safe), then check to see if church services or events have been canceled, before you go out. Look for a special email or Facebook notification, or ask your group leader.

Winter Warmth Project – Help spread warmth this winter by bringing in new and/or gently used hats, scarves, gloves and mittens to be shared with our neighbors. Both handmade and store-bought items are welcome and may be dropped off in the collection box in the Parish Hall.
